NEW ROADS & STREET WORKS

Courses

STANDARD OPERATIVE COURSES

1 DAY : UNIT 001

Cable Location & Detection can be provided as a stand alone course.

2 DAY : UNIT 002

Signing, Lighting and Guarding can be provided as a stand alone course.

Streetworks Unit 002 is now a full qualification in its own right. With effect from the 6 April 2011 for those covered by the NRASWA it became mandatory to hold a Street Works Qualification Register (SWQR) card for Unit 002.

5 DAY : UNITS 001-006 & 009

A five day course covering units 001–006 & 009 is intended for those staff with some experience in all the units being covered.

UNIT 007

Unit 007 Reinstatement in hot lay bituminous materials can normally be included in the Standard five day Operative course, providing you are able to supply your own hot lay bituminous materials.

STANDARD SUPERVISOR COURSES

2 DAY : UNIT 010

Monitoring Signing, Lighting and Guarding courses can be provided as stand alone courses for those not required to be qualified in the other units.

Streetworks Unit 010 is now a full qualification i n its own right. With effect from the 6 April 2011 for those covered by the NRASWA it became mandatory to hold a SWQR card for Unit 010.

3 DAY : UNITS 015-016

Monitoring reinstatement of concrete slabs and monitoring reinstatement of modular surfaces and concrete footways can be provided as an additional course if required.

5 DAY : UNITS 001 & 010-014

For those with experience in all modules. There is very limited time allowed for training within this programme, the emphasis being on validation and assessment of prior learning.

NRSWA CHANGES AFFECTING LICENCE RENEWALS

On 6 April 2017, new changes came into effect regarding the certificates, cards and their expiry dates.

Important changes to note are that, each certificate (Unit) now has it's own expiry date – there is no longer a single card expiry date. Key certificates (Unit 001 – coded as LA, and Unit 002 – coded as 01 or Unit 010 – coded as S1) will be featured on the front of the SWQR card, while any other certificates will be listed on the back.

The Key certificates will be valid for 5 years. While these key certificates remain valid, other certificates can be added at any time. If the Key certificates have expired, the other certificates will also become invalid until the Key certificates are renewed.

Certificates can be renewed up to 5 years after they have expired by passing a computer based multiple choice test for each certificate. If over 5 years, then the full practical assessment must be undertaken again.

Certificates can be renewed at any time from 12 months before they are due to expire. The remaining period of validity within that year will be added onto the new cards expiry date, i.e. if the certificate still has 4 months remaining before expiry, the new card's 5 year expiry date will then be increased by 4 months (becoming 5 years and 4 months). This option is useful in allowing certificates with varying expiry dates to all be renewed at the same time.

NRSWA REASSESSMENT COURSE

This is a two day course covering all Units. The two day course consists of:

DAY 1 Refresher training & preparation for the exams*DAY 2 Computer based multi choice exams

* In addition to attending refresher training candidates are strongly advised to spend time preparing for exams in advance by obtaining and familiarising themselves with the following documents:

- Specification for the Reinstatement Openings in Roads/Highways, Approved Code of Practice
- Safety at Street Works and Road Works, Approved Code of Practice (Department for Transport)
- An Introduction to Vehicle Actuated Portable Traffic Signals (Department for Transport)
- Avoiding Danger from Underground Services HSG 47 (Health and Safety Executive)
- Volume 1: NJUG Guidelines On The Positioning And Colour Coding Of Underground Utilities' Apparatus (National Joint Utilities Group)
- Roadworks Theory and Practice
- Specification for Highway Works, 'Series 1000'

As the exams are 'open book' candidates are allowed the above-mentioned documents for reference whilst completing their exams. We will provide reference materials for use during the refresher training and clean copies of these documents for the examination day, however we would strongly advise candidates to re-familiarise themselves with these documents prior to attending their course.

NEW ROADS & STREET WORKS ACT

The New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 places a duty on any person or organisation undertaking work involving the installation, renewal, maintenance or inspection of underground apparatus in any street or road to ensure that work is under the control of competent persons. To satisfy the requirements of the Act, work involving breaking up the street must be arranged under the supervision of a person having a prescribed qualification as a supervisor. In addition, whether or not the street is broken up, they must ensure that a person having a prescribed qualification as a trained operative is present on the site at all times when work is in progress.

Furthermore the local authority side of HAUC have strongly recommended that all highway authorities ensure that highway inspectors and others who are involved with the legislation should be qualified in the relevant activities.

A qualified supervisor is not required for supervising the opening of covers and chambers, or for the renewal or replacement of poles, lamps, columns and signs, pole testing and similar work involving minimal breaking up of the street or road. These types of work do, however, require the presence of a trained operative who has successfully completed a unit of competence in signing, lighting and guarding.

From 6th April 2011, street works Units 002 & 010 became full qualifications. It is now mandatory that these units are registered with SWQR in order to be recognised by the NRASWA Legislation. Details of provisions of the qualification system are contained in the Street Works (Qualifications of Supervisors and Operatives) Regulations 1992 which came into force on the 5 August 1992. The new legislation, which came into effect on the 6th April 2011 can be found in the Street Works (Qualifications of Supervisors and Operatives) (England) Regulations 2009.

A person may only act as a supervisor or trained operative for the type of work for which he/she has the relevant qualification. It may, therefore, be necessary for a number of persons having different qualifications to be involved during the progress of the work through its various stages. There is, however, no limit to the number of qualifications that may be held by one person.

After the Awarding Body has issued certificates of competence to an operative or supervisor, the required certificates that make up a qualification will be registered with the SWQR. This registration is valid for five years only.
